



## **Computers for Learning Frequently Asked Questions**

This document is designed to help you learn about GSA's Office of Personal Property Management's newly upgraded Computers for Learning (CFL) website.

### **BACKGROUND:**

#### **1. What is CFL?**

- a. CFL is a government-wide program established by Executive Order 12999 whereby educationally useful excess federal equipment can be transferred directly to schools and educational nonprofit organizations.

#### **2. What is the CFL website?**

- a. The computersforlearning.gov website is hosted by GSA to help facilitate CFL transfers between the holding federal agencies and schools and educational nonprofit organizations (EOs).

#### **3. Why is GSA modernizing the CFL website?**

- a. GSA's goal is to provide a more intuitive, user-friendly experience. The upgraded CFL site will include a modern interface, increased security, and more!

#### **4. How will computersforlearning.gov be affected?**

- a. The legacy Computersforlearning.gov website will be turned off on **June 5, 2023**. Federal agencies must completely requisition (completely transfer) all CFL transfers no later than June 5, 2023.
- b. From June 6, 2023 through July 24, 2023; schools and educational nonprofit organizations will NOT have access to the GSA-hosted CFL website.
- c. If agency policy permits, agencies can conduct direct / offline CFL transfers to schools and educational nonprofit organizations during the CFL outage. Schools / educational nonprofit organizations can work directly with owning federal agencies to arrange direct transfers.

**5. When will the CFL website go offline?**

- a. computersforlearning.gov will go offline on June 5, 2023.

**6. When will the CFL website go back online?**

- a. Computersforlearning.gov will go back online on July 24, 2023.

**7. What will the web address (URL) be?**

- a. Computersforlearning.gov will retain its existing URL.

**8. Will I have to re-register on the upgraded website?**

- a. If your organization's account is currently active, you'll be able to login to the new website using your existing email address and password.
- b. If your account is inactive in the current website, you will not be able to login to the new website until the access issue is resolved. In that case, contact the CFL Help Desk for assistance.

**TRANSITION AND KEY DATES:**

**9. Will there be a cut off for reporting property?**

- a. Federal Agencies will not be able to report new property after June 5th.

**10. Will CFL screening times be affected?**

- a. No. CFL items should still screen for 7 days.

**11. Is there a deadline for approving pending CFL transfer orders?**

- a. Yes. All outstanding transfer orders, including CFL transfers, must be completed no later than June 5, 2023.

**12. What will happen to my CFL request if it isn't fully processed before the deadline?**

- a. GSA will be working closely with federal agencies to close all transactions on time. Any CFL transactions that are not closed by June 5th will be handled on a case by case basis, with cancellation being the most likely outcome.
